

The 7 Cities Housing First Conference taking place May 7 and 8 in Edmonton

Edmonton, Alberta – May 7, 2015 – The annual 7 Cities Housing First Conference kicks off today at the Coast Edmonton Plaza Hotel. This conference is an opportunity for Housing First practitioners as well as leaders in the sector to assemble, create dialogue, and collaboratively focus our efforts on being as effective and efficient as possible to end homelessness in our communities.

"This conference is a great way to refresh and refocus our efforts to end homelessness," says Susan McGee, Chair of 7 Cities and CEO of Homeward Trust Edmonton. "The 2014 Homeless Count reflects that our efforts are needed more than ever, but we also need to celebrate the achievements that we have made six years into the provincial 10 year plan to end homelessness. Our collaborative efforts, along with the support of the province, makes this possible."

Highlights for the 2015 Housing First Conference include a wide variety of breakout sessions including several Indigenous sessions, Alberta's Youth Plan, landlord relations and engagement, homeless youth, and harm reduction. There are different keynote speakers for each day of the conference. On Thursday, May 7, Patti Laboucane and Kelly Mellings will be discussing the graphic novel The Outside Circle, which is drawn on 20 years of research based on healing and reconciliation of Aboriginal men. On Friday, the renowned Dr. Gabor Mate will bring his expertise on a wide range of topics, from addiction to mind-body wellness. The keynote address will run from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. on both days.
